TALENT

- Everyone has a unique talent of their own.
- Talent is regarded as the natural ability to do something well.
- Different people have different kinds of talents.

FAMILY TRAITS

A family trait typically refers to characters that are inherited from parents. However, family traits can also be learned.

Classification of Family Traits:

Based on the origin family traits are of two types:

- Hereditary Traits
- Acquired Traits

Hereditary Traits :-

Hereditary Traits or characteristics have been present in the individual since his birth and are passed on from one generation to the next. We often resemble one or both of our parents. At times, we also have some habits which our parents have. These are called **Hereditary Traits.**

For example , red curly hair, blood group and brown eyes.



Acquired Traits :-

Traits which develop in response to the environment and cannot be inherited. Thus we develop certain habits and characteristics due to our upbringing and the influence of the environment. These are called **Acquired Traits.**

For example : discipline and manners.
