Punctuation

Punctuation is an art of indicating certain marks in order to make the meaning clearer to understand. It also helps us to denote the pauses and intonations to be used while we read the text aloud.

Some of the mainly used punctuation marks are:

- 1. Full stop (.)**
- 2. Comma (,)**
- 3. Question mark (?)**
- 4. Semicolon (;)**

5. Colon (:)

6. Inverted commas (“”)

7. Hyphen (-)

8. Apostrophe (‘)

9. Exclamation mark (!)

10. Dash (_)

- 1. Full Stop (.):** - It is used at the end of an assertive and imperative sentences and with abbreviations.
- 2. Comma (,):** - It is usually used to denote a pause, to separate a list of items or a series of words or phrases in a sentence.
- 3. Inverted commas (“”):** - These marks are used to mark a quotation or directly reported speech.
- 4. Hyphen (-):** - It is much shorter dash and is used to join two words.
- 5. An Apostrophe (‘):** - It is used to indicate omission of a letter or letters.
- 6. Exclamation mark (!):** - This sign is used at the end of exclamatory sentences.
