SCENIC LAKES IN INDIA

Berijam lake


- **Berijam Lake is a reservoir near Kodaikanal town in Dindigul district of Tamil Nadu, South India. It is at the old site of "Fort Hamilton", in the upper Palani hills. The lake, created by a dam is part of a micro-watershed development project. Periyakulam town, 18.7 kilometres to the SE, gets its public drinking water from the lake. The lake's water quality is excellent.**



Changu Lake

- **Tsomgo Lake, also known as Tsongmo Lake or Changu Lake, is a glacial lake in the East Sikkim district of the Indian state of Sikkim, some 40 kilometres from the capital Gangtok. Located at an elevation of 3,753 m, the lake remains frozen during the winter season.**





Prashar Lake

- Prashar Lake located at an altitude of 2730 m, lies 49 km east of Mandi, Himachal Pradesh, India, with a three storied pagoda-like temple dedicated to the sage Prashar. The lake is considered sacred to the sage Parashara, who meditated here back then. The temple was built in the 13th century by Raja Bank Sen of Mandi in honor of the sage and thus, considering the Himachali architecture, the lake was named after him.

Kalagrah Dam Lake

- **Kalagarh dam lake is situated inside Jim Corbett National Park. This lake is formed due to the construction of Kalagarh Dam (also known as Ramganga Dam). It is a scenic place where many migratory birds visit during the winter season.**



Sattal Lake

- **Sattal or Sat Tal is an interconnected group of seven freshwater lakes situated in the Lower Himalayan Range near Bhimtal, a town of the Nainital district in Uttarakhand, India. During the British Raj, the area had a tea plantation, one of four in the Kumaon area at that time.**



Tam dil Lake

- Tam Dil is a reservoir lake situated 6 km from Saitual, the nearest town, and 64 km from Aizawl, the capital city of Mizoram, India. In Mizo language, the word Tam is a contraction of anṭam, which means a mustard plant; and Dil means "lake".
