


Family of the Sun

Our universe consists of **the Sun**, eight **planets** and their moons, comets, meteoroids, asteroids, and other space objects. The Sun is a big star, and all eight planets move around it. It is a huge ball of fire which gives us heat and light. Just like the sun, there are large number of stars in our universe. They appear very small as they are extremely far away from us. Planets are the natural objects which are big in size, and they go around the sun. In order from the closest to the Sun, these planets are as Mercury, Venus, Earth, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus and Neptune. Satellites are the natural objects that go around a planet. All planets in a solar system have their natural satellites except Mercury and Venus. For example, Moon is the natural satellite of our Earth. Just like planets, satellites do not have their own light.


