Experience of the Trip

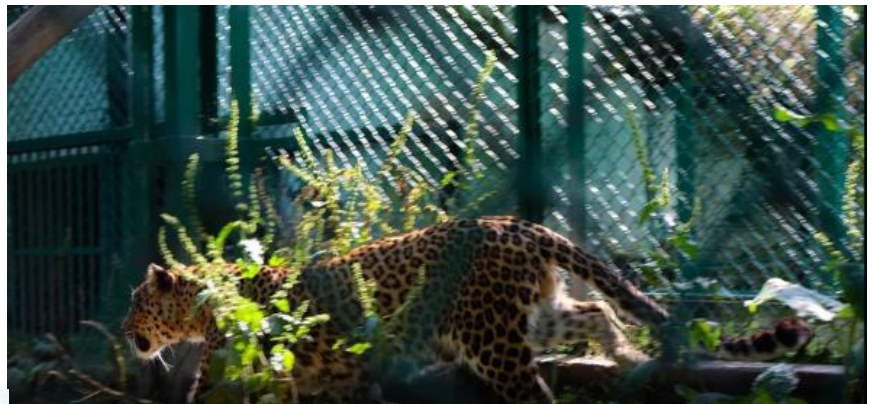

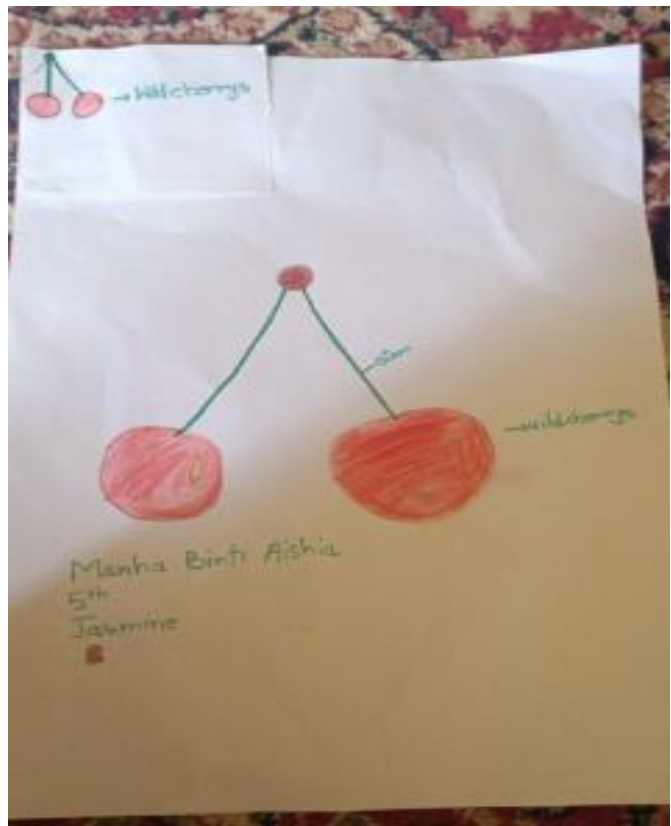
