"FROM AWARENESS TO ACTION: MANAGING DISASTERS TOGETHER"

GD Goenka Public School, Srinagar hosted a Capacity Building Programme (CBP) on Disaster Management in the School Campus on 14th June 2025. The session was organised to strengthen the preparedness of school staff in dealing with emergencies and to promote a culture of safety within the school community.

The training was conducted by two distinguished resource persons—Mr. Gulzar Ahmad Zargar, Principal Shemford Futuristic School, Wanpoh, Anantnag and Mr. Raise Ahmad, Sr. PGT Chemistry at Shemford School Anantnag.

Principal GDGPSS Mr. Johnson P J welcomed the resource persons and acknowledged the importance of CBP trainings in the professional development of teachers. He appreciated the expertise of both speakers and the relevance of such sessions in today's context.









Mr. Gulzar Ahmad led the first part of the session, introducing participants to the concept of disasters and their classification into natural, man-made, and hybrid disasters. He provided real-life examples and engaged participants in understanding the need for awareness and preparedness at the school level. He also elaborated on key disaster management strategies such as risk assessment, early warning systems, mock drills, evacuation plans, and the importance of community-based disaster preparedness. Quoting, "Disaster management is not just about response; it is about foresight, planning, and empowering every individual to act with clarity and confidence when it matters the most."

Mr. Raise Ahmad continued the training with a focus on identifying and differentiating various types of hazards, including geological, technological, biological, and human-induced. He stressed the importance of readiness at all levels—teachers, students, and the local community—working in unison to respond effectively to emergencies like earthquakes, floods, hurricanes, and even terror threats. Mr. Raise also discussed practical techniques such as hazard mapping, first aid training, formation of school disaster management committees, and coordination with local authorities during emergencies.

The training was made more engaging through interactive discussions, debates, and scenario-based activities, enabling participants to reflect and respond with practical solutions.







The programme concluded with a vote of thanks by Principal Mr. Johnson, who emphasized the need for structured disaster management teams and preparedness systems within schools. He thanked the resource persons for their valuable contribution and urged staff members to apply the knowledge gained towards building a safer and more resilient school environment.

"International Yoga Day" 2025 reiterates the relationship between personal health and balance with the planet.




